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## Litigator of the Week Runners-Up and Shout-Outs

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Shout-out to law firms representing tire makers facing claims they conspired to fix prices on replacement tires sold in the U.S. during and after the Covid-19 pandemic. U.S. District Chief Judge Sara Lioi in Akron, Ohio, who is overseeing multidistrict litigation over replacement tire prices, issued a 94-page decision dismissing the claims this week. Lioi wrote "the fact that defendants raised their prices while inflation and supply chain logistics were worsening suggests rational pricing behavior in an interdependent market, not conspiracy."
